

LYSA Meeting Minutes - DRAFT
AGM II - Presidential Vote
February 17, 2016, 7pm, Town Hall Offices

Attendees: All current LYSA executive board and board members, members of LYSA, and three non-members.

Joe Green opened the meeting, introduced the executive board members and explained this was an continuation of our 12/30/15 AGM. Motion was made by K. Stanley, seconded by S. Schreiner.

Joe explained we were there to elect a new LYSA president. He made an apology on behalf of the board regarding the recent email of former president, Patti Maccabe and asked if anybody had questions. There were none. He stated we were open to communication at any time if anybody had further questions.

Candidates Sam Schreiner and Kerri Stanley each gave brief introductions and spoke about why they were seeking the presidency. Joe commented on the 3 questions the candidates were asked from their bios, which were previously made available to members via our Facebook page and at this meeting. He suggested that members note vote for their friend, but for the best candidate based on their background and information. He commented on the last question about the relationship between LYSA and LUSC and our goal going forward with a fresh perspective for Londonderry soccer in general to be successful, coming together to work towards one goal and that we are committed to work together.

A question was asked about the volunteer fee having been increased, to which Sam and Kerri responded. Joe also commented about it.

One member asked to have their volunteer fee go to another family member who could fulfill the duty requirement if they couldn't.

Joe emphasized that LYSA was the members' organization, introduced Chantal Schreiner as our Communications Coordinator.

A question was asked about the difference between rec and travel soccer, to which Sam and Kerri again responded.

Members were given the opportunity to vote at this time and while the ballots were counted by three representatives, the raffles for the two \$50 Amazon gift cards were drawn.

It was announced that of the 32 signatures, 33 ballots had been counted but it did not affect the overall outcome and Kerri Stanley was declared the winner.
